Kentucky LMSC Annual Meeting

March 18, 2001

Vice Chair Mike Lemke called the meeting to order at 12:25 p.m. EST, in the conference room of his law office in Louisville, and determined that we had a quorum. Others attending were Meg Smath—Secretary (WILD), Melinda Schmitt—Treasurer (LAKE), Brad Schmied (CHMS), Bob Adams (OMM), Gail O'Malley (WILD), Tom Mester (CHMS), Joanne Tingley (LAKE), Janice Kregor (WILD), Pam Haeberlin (LAKE), and Tracy Elton (WILD). Chair Bill Tingley (LAKE) arrived at 1:03 p.m. Melinda left at 2:30 p.m.

Minutes of the Previous Meeting

Meg noted the following corrections to the October 29, 2000, meeting minutes. (1) Page 1, first paragraph. The correct abbreviation for Bob Adams's club is OMM, rather than MMSC. (2) Page 1, treasurer's report. Correct spelling of our bank's name is Firststar, rather than FirstStar. (3) Page 3, Meg's convention report. Delete "Bill suggested the LMSC buy mini rule books for our meets. The consensus was that we would buy 10 copies at \$3 each" and replace with "Bill moved that the LMSC buy mini rule books for our meets. Meg seconded. All aye. We will buy 10 copies at \$3 each." (4) Meg asked Mike if July 23–24, 2001, is the correct date for the SwimLouisville.com Invitational, and Mike said that the month should be June, not July. **Joanne moved, Melinda seconded, to accept the minutes as amended. All aye.**

Treasurer's Report

Melinda presented the 2000 financial report. As expected, income was behind, but, also as expected, this was remedied by the dues increase for 2001, which became effective in November 2000. The preliminary budget for 2001 shows that we will be in the black by about \$100, even with the conservative projection of dues income, which is based on only 500 swimmers. Melinda noted that she kept the convention budget the same as for 2000, even though the 2001 convention will be close (Dearborn, Mich.), and presumably cheaper than the 2000 convention in Orlando. Meg noted that we hope to be able to rent a van and have the entire LMSC drive together, rather than having to buy plane tickets for all the delegates. Meg could claim the mileage on her USMS expense account, thus leaving the LMSC responsible only for the van rental. Whether all our delegates will be able to travel together will depend on the delegates' travel schedules.

Melinda noted that we may need to budget for an upgrade to a Hy-Tek product; this item was tabled until Bill's arrival. She also noted that we will derive more income from the sanction fee for the April relay meet. Finally, she noted that we have \$2200 more this time than last year, so the measures we took to deal with a deficit budget have obviously worked. Approval of the treasurer's report was tabled until Bill's arrival.

Registrar's Report

Joanne reported that as of March 18, 2001, the LMSC has 435 registered swimmers (176 women and 259 men) and 10 registered clubs. Our retention rate for 2000 was 74.2 percent, ranking us seventh in USMS.

Top Ten Chair's Report

Bob's report is attached. Bob also noted that while proofreading Top Ten submissions, he noted only one case of a swimmer competing under two different names for different meets. Meg pointed out that no matter how many times you remind swimmers to always enter meets using the same name as on their registration cards, they still will not pay attention; it's up to the meet

directors to look at the cards, and not what the swimmers have written on their entry forms, when inputting entries into Meet Manager.

Sanctions Chair's Report

Tabled until Bill arrives.

Officials Chair's Report

Mike reported that he had worked a meet for the Kentucky School for the Blind, which unfortunately conflicted with the Wildcat meet. We will try to avoid this conflict next year. He reminded the delegates that if they're having trouble getting officials for their meets, they should remind the USA Swimming officials that officiating at a KY-LMSC meet can count as an apprenticeship for them. Bob said he had had trouble finding officials for the Kentucky Classic last November because the person who was supposed to be in charge of getting officials didn't do it, and Bob didn't find out until the last minute. Bob will make sure this is taken care of next year. Mike commented that we have a very good relationship with the USA Swimming officials in Kentucky, and we'd like to keep it that way. He encouraged more of us to get certified as USA Swimming officials so that we could volunteer to help out at their meets, and then they would be more willing to volunteer at our meets.

Fitness Chair's Report

Tom said there has not been much fitness activity in our LMSC, except for Wildcat's usual participation in the February Fitness Challenge. Meg commented that it's hard to program for fitness swimmers, because programs by their very nature are competitive. Most fitness swimmers simply want a place to swim and insurance so they can use the pool. Fitness programs should emphasize goals rather than accumulating yardage. Janice pointed out that for many fitness swimmers, keeping track of yardage is a difficult concept; they're more interested in how long or how often they swim than how far they swim. Joanne said we should point out to fitness swimmers that the benefit of participating in coached workouts is that they will learn how to swim more efficiently, and suggested we put an article in the newsletter about this. Meg said she particularly likes the "Making Masters Fun" articles that have been appearing in *SWIM Magazine*. Everybody likes to have a good time at practice, and we can all feel part of the team, whether we compete or not.

Safety Chair's Report

Mark Rogers was not here to give a report.

Ad Hoc Mini-Meets Chair's Report

Tom said that he has received many questions about the relay mini-meet, mainly about the date it will be held. Mike and Brad have also received questions. Tom felt that last year the relay meet program was overly ambitious, with two 800 relays. This year there will only be two 400 relays—one free, one medley, and the clubs can decide whether they want to put together a same-sex or mixed relay. Brad encouraged everyone to participate, because it's pretty much a sure ticket to the Top Ten. Maybe the relay meet can include a fun relay too. Meg mentioned that the Interstate Showdown meet a few years ago in Bowling Green, Ohio, had two fun relays, a 4 x 100 IM relay and a crescendo relay (first swimmer swims 50 yards, second swimmer 100 yards, third swimmer 150 yards, fourth swimmer 200 yards). The swimmers really enjoyed them, and the races were exciting to watch. Several dates were discussed for the relay meet, and Janice said that April 8 might be a good date for Wildcat because the Special Olympics meet would be at Lancaster the day before, and the staff might be willing to leave the timing equipment set up for one more day. Meg reminded everyone that if they can't arrange for electronic timing, three watches is OK. Bob

said that he probably won't be able to hold the relay meet in Owensboro. Bill (who had arrived at 1:03 p.m.) said we should make sure Mark Rogers knows about the relay mini-meet.

Newsletter Editor's Report

Mike said he's been trying to gauge if two newsletters a year is enough, and that it seems to be. Other LMSCs have lots of glitz and put lots of money into their newsletters, but most of the content is meet entries and results. We had previously decided we don't want to do that, because we feel that with each club having an entry and a copy of the meet results mailed to them, and with entry forms and meet results being posted on our website, our swimmers have ample access to this material. Meg said that she liked the fact that our newsletter is different from many of the other newsletters; we may have less content, but what we have is worth reading. Mike said he's trying to keep an educational focus, since this is what allows us nonprofit status from the U.S. Postal Service. He noted he gets very little club news, but we all agreed this was probably because the clubs already distribute the news internally, and don't figure what happens with their club is of much interest to the other clubs. Meg suggested a good article for the newsletter might be one that explains how to avoid disqualification. Meg will compile a list of the DQ's from the Wildcat meet and send them to Mike, Bill, and Pam, who will write an article. Brad suggested another good topic would be an explanation of the whistle start, which our swimmers still do not seem to have the hang of after a year! Janice said she'd like to see an article on rehabbing after injuries. Bill suggested that a good source of information for such an article might be George Veith, who just came off of shoulder surgery. Lynn Olson and E Bell, who are both orthopedic surgeons, were suggested as possible authors.

Treasurer's Report (removed from the table)

Melinda moved, Mike seconded, that we have a roll call vote to approve the 2000 financial report. The results of the vote—Bill: aye, Mike: aye, Meg: aye, Melinda: aye, Brad: aye, Bob: aye, Gail: aye, Tom: aye, Joanne: aye, Janice: aye, Pam: aye, Tracy: aye. The report was approved unanimously. Melinda asked Bill to explain about adding a budget item for an upgrade to Hy-Tek software. Bill said it's to upgrade Team Manager from the DOS version to a Windows version. Brad uses Team Manager to compile records. Along with Team Manager we would get TM Light, a standalone product we could distribute free to clubs so they could enter the data for meets, without having to have Meet Manager or Team Manager; the files from TM Light could then be e-mailed to the meet host, simplifying the meet-entry process. **Bill moved, Mike seconded, that we add \$200 to the budget for 2001 to buy the update for Team Manager, if it should become available in 2001 (it may not be ready until 2002). All aye.** Bob asked if there were any more updates to Meet Manager, and Bill said no. Melinda will add projected income from the April relay meet and September open water swim, so that we will have a zero budget. **Bill moved, Bob seconded, that the Executive Committee be empowered to spend up to 25 percent of the budget during the year in an emergency; this amounts to \$750. All aye.**

Sanctions Chair's Report (removed from table)

Joanne reported that Louisville Y has applied for and received recognition for their open-water swim June 2. Meg and Pam will be the observers. Bill noted that the most important thing for holding a successful (and safe) open water swim is manpower. He also noted that we can't put the entry for this meet on our website because it is not sanctioned by the LMSC. Joanne added that the Swimlouisville.com meet has been sanctioned, and that the Lakeside meet has been moved to August 11-12, in order to avoid a conflict with a convention. Bill reported that there will be an open water swim on September 8 at the Boy Scout Camp in Shepherdsville, which will be dual sanctioned by USMS and USA Swimming. In order to get the participation of college swimmers

from both UK and U of L, a 5K swim will be added to the program. College swimmers will have to be members of USA or USMS.

Records Chair's Report

Brad reported that Bill went through his old files and found quite a few old meet results, which should have a big impact on records. Brad added that he's writing an application that will allow a swimmer to compare his or her times with all the results from 1990. Bill encouraged everyone to look through their old meet results and find out if they have any results Brad might be missing. Bill also suggested that Brad password-protect this application so that only LMSC swimmers can use it.

Ad Hoc Internet Chair's Report

Meg said she had corrected the results for the Wildcat meet but had not yet replaced the results on the website. She will send the updated database to Bill and Brad. Meg asked that clubs notify her if the leadoff swimmers are listed incorrectly in the meet results, since this could affect leadoff splits submitted for Top Ten. Meg asked that everyone notify her (preferably at work—msmath@kgs.mm.uky.edu) when they need her to make updates. Bill reported that his work Internet account will be changing, and he will no longer be able to provide Joanne with a free alias. Bill asked if we have any open e-mail accounts associated with our BluegrassNet account. Meg said she thought we had one, which had never been used because she used her own account, so it should be available for Joanne. Mike will ask Norm Schippert, his teammate, who is president of the company, if we can get a free account for Joanne. Bill said the new account will be needed within a week or so. Mike said that he will be trying out taking meet entries online for the SwimLouisville.com meet. He contacted Jim Matysek, the USMS webmaster, and asked for suggestions on how we should go about this, since he has made this possible for Nationals on usms.org. Jim would not give out his proprietary program, but suggested we contract with a private company such as SignMeUpSports.com. Mike suggested that if someone else wants to try this for their meet they should use a different service so we can see how the two services compare. The way it works is that the company accepts the credit card payment, then charges the meet host a fee of \$1.20 per entry. Then the company sends the meet host a check. Mike already has a basic entry form on SwimLouisville.com, but will be modifying it to add the option to buy T shirts and register for the social. The one monkey wrench is that we have to make sure all swimmers sign the USMS waiver when they show up at the meet.

Unfinished Business

Bill noted that the cost for last year's sanctioned open water swim was \$835, and entry fees will not be high enough to cover this expense. The SeaHawks can supply the manpower, and the LMSC can best help by getting sponsors for the meet. It costs a minimum of \$200 to rent the facility, and this does not include lifeguards. Eventually, if the meet becomes popular enough, we'll need EMS on site, which will be \$40 an hour. Bill suggested we begin with a meet budget of \$1000, and we could reach this by offering two levels of sponsorship. For the highest level, \$500, the meet would be named for the sponsor. For the other level, \$100, the sponsor's name would be printed on the back of the T shirt. Anything more than \$1000 that the LMSC raises would be rolled over to next year's meet. In-kind donations are welcome in addition to cash. Meg will ask Rick Pannell about donating day-glo swim caps for the meet. Bob noted that we should have a written statement about what sponsorship entails when we approach sponsors. **Mike moved, Meg seconded, that the LMSC solicit sponsors at the \$100 and \$500 levels for the open water swim in September. All aye.**

New Business

Meet Schedule. Bill suggested that we think about changing our meet schedule for next year in order to take advantage of the FINA “racehorse rule.” All our meters meets are after the middle of the year, so there’s no advantage to artificially aging up on January 1. If we hold the SCM Kentucky Classic in the spring instead of the fall, swimmers with birthdays late in the year will get to age up sooner. If we hold the SCY Wildcat meet in the fall instead of the spring, it won’t make any difference for aging up, because the swimmers will be competing at their actual ages. Joanne pointed out that a SCY meet in November would be too late to count for that year’s Top Ten; Bob said the times would count for the following year, however. Brad said that fall is the time of year when his club’s participation is lowest, and that would seem to be incompatible with the meet with his club’s highest participation (Wildcat). Meg said having their meet in the fall might simplify the problem of trying to juggle Easter, two spring breaks (public school’s and UK’s), and conflicts with USA Swimming’s schedule; but in the fall they would be competing with UK’s varsity meet schedule. She would have to ask Wynn Paul his opinion. This will be a discussion item for next year.

Formation of the LMSC. Bill announced that, this being our annual meeting, it was time to dissolve the old LMSC and form a new one. Joanne read off the number of delegates each registered club is entitled to, based on the number of registered swimmers, and the delegates for each club were stated, if known:

Lakeside Masters (LAKE): four delegates (Bill Tingley, Joanne Tingley, Pam Haeberlin, Melinda Schmitt)

Frankfort Area Swim Masters (FASM): one delegate (to be announced)

Wildcat Masters (WILD): six delegates; Wildcat will use only four of its slots (Meg Smath, Janice Kregor, Gail O’Malley, Tracy Elton)

Crescent Hill Masters Swimming (CHMS): two delegates (Tom Mester and Brad Schmied)

Louisville Y Masters (LOUY): one delegate (Freda Holderman)

Western Kentucky Green Gators (WKGG): one delegate (Mark Rogers)

Owensboro Marlin Masters (OMM): one delegate (Bob Adams)

McDowell Wellness Center Masters (MWCM): one delegate (Russ Goodwin)

Eagle Masters Swimming (EMS): one delegate (David Oyen)

New club—Caritas Masters: one delegate (to be announced)

Total delegates is 17, making 10 our quorum.

Elections. Bill called for elections, as provided in our bylaws. The four current officers announced their intention to stand for reelection. **Joanne moved that nominations be closed, Tracy seconded. All aye. Bill moved that we elect the nominated slate, Meg seconded. All aye.**

Appointments. Bill made the following appointments:

Mike moved, Bob seconded, that Bill's appointments be approved. All aye.

Other Business. Bob asked about the status of the new U of L natatorium. Bill said they have raised \$15 million of the \$16 million needed before ground can be broken.

Adjournment

Joanne moved to adjourn, Tracy seconded. All aye. Meeting adjourned at 2:52 p.m.
